30th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (B)

“But many of them scolded him and told him to keep quiet, but he only shouted all the louder.”

First Reading (Jeremiah 31:7-9) An exhortation to shout and praise the Lord, for his divine plan is to bring his people home from exile in the lands of the north and the far ends of the earth.

Second Reading (Hebrews 5:1-6) The Hebrews are reminded that priests are human, and that they are able to sympathize with sinners because of it. Each priest – even Christ – is called by God.

Gospel (Mark 10:46-52) The story of Bartimaeus the blind beggar, who broke through the disapproving crowd to demand the attention of Jesus, and whose faith led to his sight being restored.

Reflection:

The Gospel provides an insight into the life of Jesus.

Jesus is just about to make His entrance into Jerusalem to be the perfect High Priest and perfect Victim.

Jesus has come among mortals, shared in the human conditions which include suffering, temptations, trials, and tribulations. Jesus, united with us in our human nature, fulfills His call as the great High Priest by offering Himself as the Victim Who truly brings healing, wholeness, and salvation to the people.

All of us are part of the process of salvation and sanctification.

Through our baptism, we are priestly people. We have the mission to sanctify (make holy and whole) and to help bring to others the message of Jesus' act of salvation.


It is important that we pray for more people to respond to God's call to be of service to the community of faith. We need ordained individuals to carry on the sacramental ministry within the church. But we must always realize that all of us, by virtue of our baptism, are called to share in the one and only priesthood of Jesus Christ. We are invited, and required, to work for the sanctification of others – their awareness of their own holiness because of the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross. Let us continue to pray for more workers (both ordained and lay) to go out in the fields and work for the harvesting of souls as God intends.
