32nd SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (Year-B)

First Reading (1 Kings 17:10-16) The widow made a little cake and brought it to Elijah.

Second Reading (Hebrews 9:24-28) Christ appeared once for all to remove sin by the sacrifice of himself.

Gospel (Mark 12:38-44)

Jesus admires the generosity of a poor widow, but criticises the Temple for taking what she cannot really afford.

Reflection:

The life of a follower of the Lord Jesus should be one of giving all one has and trusting in Jesus.

Today's readings are challenging for **US**. We ask ourselves, "do we trust as much as the two widows in the readings today?" Yes, we believe in God's providence, yet we also seem to have a need to hold onto things – just in case. We should also ask ourselves, "Do We give enough to the ministry of the church?"

Trusting in God's providence means moving forward, not spending time worrying about what comes next. Trust does not lessen our need to think and act fully, but it lessens our concerns about what lies ahead. If we trust God, we can act confidently, yet not self-righteously like the religious leaders mentioned in the first part of the Gospel. The confidence is placed in God's love and care for us, not in our own importance. Placing our trust in God makes us shift our attention away from ourselves to focusing on others and our call to bring God's Good News in action and words to others. The more we are able to look beyond ourselves to God's action, especially in the life, ministry, death, and resurrection of Jesus, the more we will allow God's action to continue in our lives and the lives of the needy around us.

We need to focus on the one and only priesthood of Jesus Christ and realize that we are invited to share in that priesthood by our reaching out to those "bowed down" and "bent over."

May you continue to trust in God and live a life of loving service to all whom the Lord Jesus places in your path.

Remembrance Day Thursday, November 11



On Remembrance Day all members of the armed forces who died and gave their lives so that we may enjoy our freedom are commemorated. The other common name for this day is Armistice Day which marks the date and time when armies stopped fighting World War I, November 11th at 11a.m. in 1918 (the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month). Many Canadian soldiers died in the First and Second World Wars, the Korean War and on other battle grounds.

This is the day we pray for peace, to consider what we are doing as individuals, as a community and as a nation to bring God's peace into the world.

WARDENS' ELECTION – Sunday November, 2021

According to the Fabrique Act a meeting for the purpose of an election of 2 Wardens must take place every year. However, due to the pandemic no Election was held in 2020. Therefore, 3 positions are up for renewal and 1 for stepping down. A meeting will take place for the election of 4 Wardens, on Sunday November 28, after the 11:00 a.m. in the Parish hall. This is a 3 year Mandate and a Warden can run for 2 consecutive terms of 3 years after which they must step down for a year. The person must be a parishioner and living within the Parish boundaries of Cote St Luc.

These 4 positions must be filled.

The Pastor and the board of 6 Warden's are responsible for the Financial Administration of the Parish. If anyone is interested to join the board of Warden's please contact Fr. George Joseph or one of the present Wardens.
