Gospel (Mark 13:24-32)


Jesus will return in glory, though it is useless to speculate on the day or hour of his coming.

Reflection:

We are being given a “revelation” about the end times – the end of our world as we know it.

With all the natural and human-caused disasters of late (hurricanes, earthquakes, tsunamis, flooding, the pandemic), the bellicose action of some people and nations, and the supposed prophecies of the end of the world over the last two decades, some people are worried that the world is coming to an end. Well, the truth is that it will come to an end. But, as we will hear in today’s Gospel, no one knows when. The key point for us, as followers of the Lord Jesus, is to live lives which show we are prepared for His return whenever that may be, whether today, tomorrow, at the end of long lives, or millennia from now. We must demonstrate that our orientation is towards God. We should desire to follow, and be working at following, the Lord Jesus as He modeled what it means to be people of the Reign of God. If we are striving to do that, even if we encounter rough times, then we should not worry but joyfully anticipate His return and the coming at the end of time.

As we approach the end of another church year, may the Lord Jesus continue to strength you as you await His final coming at the end of time.

According to the Fabrique Act a meeting for the purpose of an election of 2 Wardens must take place every year.

However, due to the pandemic no Election was held in 2020.

Therefore, 3 positions are up for renewal and 1 for stepping down.

A meeting will take place for the election of 4 Wardens, on Sunday November 28, after the 11:00 a.m. in the Parish hall.

This is a 3 year Mandate and a Warden can run for 2 consecutive terms of 3 years after which they must step down for a year.

The person must be a parishioner and living within the Parish boundaries of Cote St Luc.

These 4 positions must be filled.

The Pastor and the board of 6 Warden’s are responsible for the Financial Administration of the Parish. If anyone is interested to join the board of Warden’s please contact Fr. George Joseph or one of the present Wardens.
