34th & LAST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (B)

Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of The Universe
"YES I AM KING."

First Reading (Daniel 7:13-14)

Daniel tells of his vision of the Lord returning as a glorious king.

Second Reading (Revelation 1.5-8)

The ruler of the kings of the earth has made us to be a kingdom, priests serving his God.

Gospel (John 18: 33b-37)

St John recounts the dialogue between Jesus and Pilate.
Jesus is a king, but his kingdom is not of this world.

Reflection:

This celebration of Christ the King comes at the end of the liturgical year. It is the "crown" of the year in that it summarizes what has been celebrated all year and it looks forward to the Reign of Christ at the end of time. In an apparent contrast to the other readings of the day, the Gospel comes from the passion of Jesus. It reminds us that Jesus' Reign was established by His suffering and death, and reaches its moment of climax in His resurrection from the dead on the third day and His ascension forty days later. As we complete another liturgical year, we celebrate the Reign of the Lord Jesus which was begun through Jesus' life, ministry, death, and resurrection, but will not reach its completion until Jesus returns at the end of time to take final control of all peoples, nations, and life. We are living in the "already, but not yet" time of the Reign of Jesus the King.

Today, as we celebrate the Solemnity of Jesus Christ, our King, we realize how Jesus is the key role model of leadership and that He led by coming not to be served but to serve and to give His life for others. It is important for us to acknowledge Jesus as our true Leader and King, to place Him on the throne of our lives, and to serve others as He did.

This is the fitting way to end this liturgical year and look forward to the coming season of Advent, the beginning of a new liturgical year.

May you continue to experience the joys of the Reign of God in your life and may it motivate you to serve others so they too can know the holiness and blessedness of being part of the Reign of God.

A meeting will take place for the election of 4 Wardens, next Sunday November 28, after the 11:00 a.m. in the Parish hall.

This is a 3 year Mandate and a Warden can run for 2 consecutive terms of 3 years after which they must step down for a year.

The person must be a parishioner and living within the Parish boundaries of Cote St Luc.

These 4 positions must be filled.
