*“No greater love does anyone have than to lay down one’s life for another”.*


#### First Reading (Acts 14:21-27)

They called the Church together and related all that God had done with them.

#### Second Reading (Revelation 21:1-5)

A new Jerusalem appears where God lives among humans. God will wipe away the tears from every eyes and there will be no more death.

#### Gospel (John 13:31-35)



<sup>34</sup> “I give you a new command: Love one another. Just as I have loved you, you must also love one another. <sup>35</sup> By this all people will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another.”

**Reflection** Today’s readings share essential Christian themes of death, redeeming sacrifice and eternal life. Jesus’ actions are powerful, but they need some explanation. It comes in two forms. First, he says, “Now has the Son of Man been glorified, and in him God has been glorified.” This statement means that in Jesus’ action we see the work of God. The Son of Man, is demonstrating such all-embracing and all-powerful love, is the manifestation and the reality of the very love of God. The ultimate expression and reality of God’s love is when the Son of Man, who came not to condemn the world but so that through him the world might be saved, will make his ultimate, total and infinite act of love when he is lifted up cross. There is no possible fuller expression of God’s love than this. Jesus also gave a new commandment to his disciples – to love as he loved them. Jesus points out that this kind of love is what makes us Christians – “everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another, as I have loved you.”

**May you continue to experience the newness which comes from God’s unconditional love for you.**
