First Reading (Acts 15:1-2. 22-29)

It has seemed good to the Holy Spirit and to us to impose on you no further burden than what is essential.

Second Reading (Revelation 21:10-14. 22-23)

The Lord prepares for all his people a radiant and peaceful future in the new Jerusalem. In the Spirit we catch a glimpse of this promise.

Gospel (John 14:23-29)

As Jesus prepares to leave his friends, he promises that the Spirit will be given them, and will bring them peace and courage in all the difficulties and uncertainties that lie ahead.



Reflection Today we are given a glimpse of the process that God puts into place to bring about Light – the divine plan of salvation.

Changes, loss, moving on – these things shape our lives at all levels. While such experiences are at best unsettling, and at worst distressing, they are always, in Christian living, moments with the potential for grace, places where the Spirit seeks to come and lead us on.

As Blessed John Henry Newman remarked:

“To live is to change. To be perfect is to have changed often.”

Today as we reflect on our being used by God to help enlighten the world, We are reminded of the words of today’s psalm:

“May God let the Divine face shine upon us. So may Your way be known upon earth; among all nations, Your salvation.” The Light which shines on us is the face of God, the Triune presence of God Who wishes all to be united in the love, life, and peace which flows between the **Abba**, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. That is the plan of God’s salvation.

And that is what we are privileged to experience and reflect in our lives, in the lives of those we love, and within the Church and the world.

May you continue to fulfill God’s plan for your being a source of bringing the Light of Christ to others.
