PENTECOST SUNDAY (Year C)

“Receive the Holy Spirit.”



First Reading (Acts 2:1-11)

When the Holy Spirit came upon the apostles, people from all over the world heard the Good News proclaimed in their own language.

Second Reading (1 Cor 12.3b-7, 12-13)

In the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body.

Gospel (John 20.19-23)

Jesus promises that the Holy Spirit will remain with the disciples, to teach them and remind them of all he has taught.

Reflection

Today we celebrate Pentecost – the coming of the Holy Spirit, the birthday of the Church, the end of the Easter Season. Our readings speak of the gift of the Holy Spirit and what that means for the Church, i.e., US.

Today is all part of the paschal (Easter) mystery. In fact, the Gospel reading comes from a Resurrection appearance on Easter Sunday afternoon.

The First Reading of the first Pentecost is proclaimed in multiple languages at the same time. It is an appropriate time to worship together and realize that even in our diversity, we are one in the Lord Jesus in the unity of the Holy Spirit. We are called to unite and pray together so that we can enrich each other with the various ministries we share for the common Good of all.

Because we know that we are loved by God, we can love one another. The Holy Spirit helps us to know and understand the love of God revealed in the death and resurrection of Jesus.

May you continue to be filled with the Holy Spirit so that you may use the gifts (charismata or charisms) which God has given you for the edification of the community of believers.
