THE SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST (Corpus Christi) (Year C)

First Reading (Genesis 14:18-20)

The bread and wine offered in praise and thanksgiving by the priest, Melchizedek, point to the significance of Jesus' sharing at the Last Supper.

Second Reading (1 Corinthians 11: 23-26)

As often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

Gospel (Luke 9:11-17) All ate and were filled.

Reflection

On this day, we celebrate the Lord's giving of His Body and Blood to us, in reality, by His freely chosen death and resurrection, and sacramentally in the Eucharist.

Today's gospel message is quite obvious: Jesus, who responds to and reaches out to people in their need, wants his followers to do the same. The central question for all of us is: Do we live in memory of him when we gather to celebrate the Eucharistic meal? In other words, do we remember all that he said and do we practice what he did? Just as Jesus gave his life for the life of the world, so we are being challenged to follow his example – accepting that it can be extremely difficult to prioritize the interest of others rather than our own. The challenge of today's gospel and feast is in living with and relating to others, can we offer them the kind of bread they long for? The bread that nourished other people in their need.

May you continue to come to the Lord Jesus and be fed by Him and in return give thanks to GOD as you proclaim the Good News by your living out your relationship with Jesus.
