### 16th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (Year C)

*"With God All Things Are Possible!"*

#### **First Reading** (Genesis 18.1-10a)

Abraham said, "Lord, do not pass by your servant."

#### **Second Reading** (Colossians 1.24-28)

I am making known the mystery hidden throughout the ages, now revealed to his saints.

#### **Gospel** (Luke 10:38-42) Martha welcomes Jesus into her home. "Mary has chosen the better part."

#### **Reflection**

As we reflect on today's Gospel readings we realize that there are a lot of actions which demonstrate that we have a relationship with the Lord Jesus. Three of those are mentioned in today's readings: hospitality, suffering, and sitting at the feet of the Master. We must be aware of each situation we are in and decide what sort of response is the most appropriate at the time. There are certain circumstances when it is important that we demonstrate hospitality to others, in order to share the Good News with them. At other times, we must be willing to suffer as a result of demonstrating our commitment to the Gospel. Being dedicated to a cause often means doing things which are not pleasant to others, but must be done. And what better cause for which to suffer than the cause of Jesus? The third action mentioned in the readings is that of sitting and listening to the Lord Jesus. As faithful, disciplined learners, we must come to the Master and learn from Him. Jesus calls this action as performed by Mary in the Gospel, "the better part." It is the action which is essential for all true disciples, whether they spent most of the time in the service of hospitality or suffering for the cause. And yet, many believers are more devoted to action or passion than to meditation and reflection. We must listen to His Word and reflect on how we can apply it to our day of service and possible suffering. The Word of the Lord, taken, digested, and linked to our daily activities, is the food and drink we must partake each and every day. In doing so, we will truly "live in the presence of the Lord" as the Responsorial mentions.

**May you be strengthened by your personal time with the Master and may that move you to be more hospitable to those who cross your path and endure whatever comes your way.**

## CINÉMAS GUZZO PROVIDES VISIBILITY DURING THE POPE'S VISIT TO QUÉBEC

Largest independent cinema chain in the province offers free viewing of the papal visit to Québec on all 143 movie screens in the Greater Montréal Area

**Montréal, July 14, 2022** - Cinémas Guzzo, the largest independent cinema chain in Québec, becomes an important partner in the papal visit at the end of July of this year. The cinema chain will make its 143 movie screens in 10 complexes in the Greater Montréal Area available to mark the occasion. This will allow thousands of people to collectively experience this historic moment in a comfortable setting - giving easy access to those who want to partake in this significant visit.

This initiative, developed by Cinémas Guzzo's President and CEO, Mr. Vincenzo Guzzo in collaboration with the Mgr. Arthur Deschênes Foundation, will give thousands of people the opportunity to see for free the broadcast of this important mass at the Basilica of Sainte-Anne de Beauré on July 28 at 10:00 am, where more than 15,000 people, including First Nations, Métis and Inuit, survivors, victims of Residential Schools and their families, will be gathered.

While access to the event in the cinemas is free, voluntary donations will be collected under the direction of the Mgr. Arthur Deschênes Foundation. These funds will be transferred entirely to the fundraising campaign for the papal visit.

Mr. Guzzo states: "Pope Francis' visit is historic. Engaging with Indigenous peoples on Canadian soil is the one of many steps forward in the discussion about the consequences of the actions of members of the Catholic Church, in particular the painful and unacceptable legacy of residential schools in this country. We can all do our part to build a path towards truth and reconciliation, I wanted to contribute as much as I could."

Cardinal Gérald Cyprien Lacroix, coordinator for the papal visit in Québec, shares his gratitude: "I want to thank Mr. Guzzo for his offer that will allow many to experience this historic moment in our community. The great generosity expressed by several partners shows a common desire to make this event a moment of healing, as well as a milestone in the relations between Indigenous people and society as a whole."
