32nd SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (C)

“He is God, not for the dead, but of the living.”

First Reading (2 Maccabees 7:1-2. 9-14)

The seven brothers place their trust in God
and in the resurrection from the dead.

Second Reading (2 Thessalonians 2:16-3:5)

Paul encourages the Thessalonians to persevere in their faith.

Gospel (Luke 20:27-38)

Despite the mocking of the Sadducees, Jesus shows that God’s very nature
means there is a resurrection from the dead for those who are worthy.

Reflection:

As we move toward the last three Sundays of the Church Year, our focus
turns toward “the end times”. We are reminded that earthly death is not
really the end of existence, but death is the movement into the beginning of
the end which last forever. Our First Reading describes a Jewish family’s
belief in the afterlife (or life after death). The Responsorial Psalm can be
seen as a reference to heavenly existence when one will “behold GOD’s
face.” In the Second Reading, St. Paul addresses his audience in
Thessalonika by informing them that GOD gives “everlasting
encouragement” so that the faithful will live a life which promotes the
spread of the Good News. In the Gospel, Jesus confronts the Sadducees
with an explanation of the heavenly existence which is totally beyond
earthly experiences.

No matter how deep our grief, this month of prayer is an affirmation of our
faith in the power of God’s love, which is stronger than death. It is an
expression of our hope in the resurrection: that just as GOD our Father
raised Christ from the dead, so he will raise all those who belong to him.

May the Lord strengthen your hearts in every good work and word.
