First Reading (Jeremiah 20:10-13)

Jeremiah begs God to grant him peace from the enemies who are whispering against him.

Second Reading (Romans 5:12-15)

As through one person, Adam, sin entered the world, so through one person, Jesus, grace has abounded even more.

Gospel (Matthew 10:26-33)

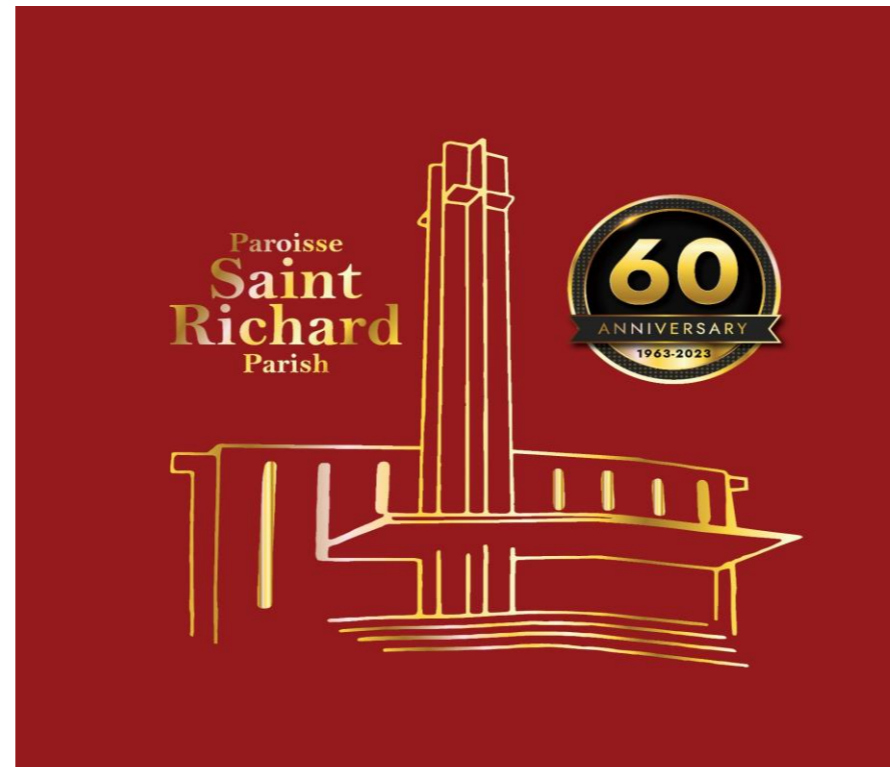
Jesus urges us not to fear: in the Father's sight, the very hairs of our head are numbered.

Reflection:

“Do not be afraid”: the words are especially powerful because the one who speaks them is our friend, who really knows us, who loves us and whom we love; he is a friend we can trust. It's he who brings us new heart today as, over and over again, he urges us not be afraid.

That doesn't meant that all our fears suddenly vanish but rather that they don't paralyze us, they no longer dominate our lives, because, like Jeremiah in today's first reading, we can say, “the Lord is at my side, a mighty hero”. Each Mass brings not only an assurance that Jesus has proved himself our friend – even to the shedding of his blood – but also a promise that he takes away our final fear, the fear of what awaits us beyond death.

May you be strengthened to live out your call of being a disciple of the Lord Jesus, especially when facing trying times.
