SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - (Year B) WORLD DAY OF THE SICK

First Reading (Leviticus 13:1-2.45-46)

Laws are imposed on Israel regarding leprosy. We can understand the fear in a community when a skin compliant which looks like decomposition is found in the camp: dire measures are enforced.

The psalm speaks about the need for spiritual healing from the blemish of sin.

Second Reading (1 Corinthians 10:31-11:1)

Paul insists that whatever is done should be done in the name of the Lord, and that nothing offensive should be done to anyone.


Gospel (Mark 1:40-45)

Jesus does the unthinkable. He not only cures a leper, he touches him, thereby incurring the life of a leper: exclusion and isolation from people.

Reflection

Leprosy was the great taboo in ancient world:
lepers were cut off from all human contact. Outreach to lepers plays
a large part in Jesus' Mission; he reaches out to the most marginalized
people in society. As Jesus effectively changes places with the leper we
see what happens when Jesus dies for us – exchanging places with sinful
humanity as He bears the consequences of human sin on our behalf.
How do we express solidarity with those who suffer marginalization today?
Are we being united in their suffering, are we fulfilling the words of St. Paul
today: "whatever you do, do everything for the glory of God."

May you continue to come to the Lord Jesus and seek the solace which He offers you so that you can be a whole and healthy member of the community of faith.

Lord, as the Spirit led you into the desert to face temptation, so may that same spirit guide us this Lent as we seek to follow your way more faithfully.




